

Question tags

A question tag is formed by inverting the subject and verb of a statement. If the subject is a noun, it may be necessary to change the noun into a pronoun, such as in the statement "The dog hasn't eaten dinner yet, has he?" Question tags can also be formed with dummy pronouns like it and there.

Negative Question Tag Examples

Negative question tags are used when the speaker's statement is positive. For example:

- He wants chocolate ice cream, doesn't he?
- · Today is your birthday, isn't it?
- They are twins, aren't they?

These question tags are all considered negative because they include the negative form of the auxiliary verb.

Special Cases of Question Tags

There are also special cases in which the question tag may seem surprising. Sometimes the question tag does not resemble the statement, such as with adverbs, imperatives, invitations, and same-way question tags. The use of the words nothing, nobody, could, would, should, and the phrase I am are also considered special cases.

Adverbs

Sentences that include negative adverbs of frequency like never, rarely, and hardly are always considered negative statements, even though the main verb is positive. The question tag should therefore be positive. For example, "We rarely eat out at restaurants nowadays, do we?" or "You never go to the gym, do you?"

Negative Question Tags and "I Am"

When a speaker makes a positive statement with the phrase "I am", the question tag changes to the special form of "aren't I?" For example, "I'm an intelligent person, aren't I?"
