For MIS 'e-campus' ERP software is used. The list of modules included in this software is:

- The Institution maintains a management information system for academic and administrative activities using an ERP software called 'e-campus'. A separate module is available in the ERP to enter the students' details who come for admission enquiry. After admission through counselling or management, all the personal details of the students are entered in the ERP software. For HR management, Staff Personal details, staff attendance entry modules are available with Finger print biometrics for staff attendance.
- Teaching learning process is maintained with separate module for students attendance entry. At the end of every week, the consolidated attendance report is auto generated for further follow up. The students applying for medical leave and on duty leave are also updated in the attendance monitoring system of ERP. A separate module to prepare lesson plan is available. Question banks, Course materials can be uploaded in this module. Unit test, model exam question papers can also be uploaded. The ERP software has a separate timetable section in which the class time table, staff time table and the internal assessments schedule can be entered. After the examinations, the marks are entered in the marks entry section and if the student is absent for the exam, retest option is also available which can be activated for the eligible students.
- Modules to include Hostel details, transport details, Fees details, Account details, Admission details, Scholarship details are also available in this software.
- The Central Library of our institution is automated with MODERNLIB- Library management software. This software contains modules like Cataloguing, Transaction Counter, admin, auto search, resource reservation, user query details and acquisition and serial control. The software permits the administrator to insert, update and view the details such as book, member, author, subject, department, publisher/supplier, back volumes reports in the cataloguing module.

# 1.1 Curriculum Planning and Implementation

Indra Ganesan College of Engineering, Trichy is approved by All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi and affiliated to Anna University, Chennai. The curriculum prescribed by Anna University is followed to impart subject knowledge to the students. Objectives and outcomes of the course are clearly made understood to the students before the commencement of every course to impart the importance of the course for their study.

The academic schedule for the entire year is well planned and made known to students and faculty members by issue of academic calendar for every semester. Academic calendar includes unit test schedule, model exams, and various events to be conducted in a semester like symposiums, College Day, Graduation Day, Engineers' Day.

In each semester, courses are allotted to teachers based on individual preference, experience, area of specialization and performance in previous years. Timetable for the entire semester is framed with provision for Value Added Courses, Library, seminar and Project. All the faculty members shall prepare and submit their course file in the beginning of the semester to the Head of the department. Course files includes syllabus, lesson plan, notes on lesson, question bank, Programme outcome, course outcome, programme objective and programme specific objectives. Question papers are prepared based on previous year University questions. Three Unit tests and two model examinations are conducted for theory courses and one model practical exam is conducted before the commencement of university examination. Answer scripts are valued, scrutinized by HOD and progress reports are dispatched to parents.

Based on their test performance, slow learners and quick learners are identified. Special coaching classes are conducted for slow learners to improve their performance in their subsequent exams and Co-Curricular Activities such as imparting communication skills, English proficiency, aptitude, interview practices, and certificate courses are conducted for the quick learners. Seminars for students are given for the better understanding of the course. Mentor system at the rate of 12 students per teacher is followed promote individual interaction with the students more effectively. Mentor-mentees meetings are conducted on every Friday last period. Teachers are allowed to attend faculty development programme, one per semester to strengthen their knowledge. Faculty members are advised to deliver lecture in the name "Seminars on innovations" in all the morning sessions on working Saturdays by all the departments.

Industrial visits to places like ISRO, Doordarshan Kendra, Hindustan Aeronautical Limited are arranged for the students apart from permitting to attend In-Plant Training and Industrial Internship. Students' attendances are monitored through student's course record and eCampus ERP Software. Apart from this, weekly attendance status is prepared, and undertaking is obtained from students who secure less than 75%. Class committee meeting is conducted to monitor the progress of theory and laboratory courses in line with lesson plans. Apart from regular laboratory classes, practical demonstration on theory topics is also conducted to strength theory knowledge.

Remote access to online resources like e-Journals and e-Books is available to all students and teachers, apart from using DELNET available in our Digital library.

# 2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Our affiliating Anna University prescribes three Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) tests in assemester. But, our College conducts five tests, three tests are for 50 marks are conducted for I-Unit, II-Unit and IV-Unit and two tests for 100 marks are conducted as Model Exam for first three units and all five units. The faculty members handling the subjects set the question papers which are verified by a Senior Faculty member and HOD. Two or three random answer booklets are evaluated by the concerned HOD and constructive improvement tips are given to the students through the subject handling teacher. The University Exam Pattern for improving the presentation skill of our students are demonstrated in the class which includes, Do's and Don'ts in the exams, the time management strategies, theway of presenting the content in the paper. Keys for university question papers are prepared by the faculty members and the same is kept as reference in the library. The best answer booklets of both the Unit Test and the Model Exam are selected and circulated to the students in the class to motivate them for further improvement in their performance. In order to improve the analytical skills, logical thinking, Problem solving capabilities of the students, the HOTS questions are included in Part-C of thequestion paper. This make the students to focus on today's challenging competitive career aspects.

# **2.5.3** Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

In the beginning of a semester, academic calendar is prepared in discussion with all the HoDs.Reopening date of the semester, number of days allotted to complete a unit, workshops, seminars, guestlectures, Conferences, College annual day celebration, graduation day, faculty development programme, symposiums are preplanned in the meeting with HoDs and they are incorporated in theacademic calendar. Considering the prefixed programme, exam date for Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE)isfixed. Theacademic calendarisdisplayed on notice board and also available in website for the use of students and faculty members. Since sufficient space is given for all the activities, CIE tests are conducted without any disturbance to the students. Three unit tests and two model exam will be

normallyconductedforCIE. The institution has centralized Examcell to conduct CIE asperthes chedulementioned in the academic calendar. The exam cell coordinator of the institute prepares a common time table for all the departments for the smooth conduct of the exam well before the beginning of the CIE tests as per the academic calendar. The results of CIE tests are declared and informed to the students within the stipulated period of time. The faculty members prepared the lesson plan well in advance adhering to the academic calendar. The lesson plan will be submitted along with the course file before the beginning of the semester to

the HoD for approval. Lab Manuals will be prepared/updated according to the curriculum before the commencement of every semester.

Institution has a separate team to maintain the physical facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

#### **Physical facilities:**

The maintenance team comprises of the Estate officer. Supervisor, Electrician and his team to take care of the regular maintenance of civil works and electrical works such as repairing, wiring, plaster

works, painting, carpentry, plumbing, housekeeping, maintenance of restrooms, approach roads and neatness of the entire premises. Complaint and service registers are maintained for all the above facilities. Transportofficer takes care of the maintenance of buses in the institution.

#### **Laboratories:**

The Institution has well established laboratories for all the departments. All the departments maintainservice register and maintenance registers for laboratory purpose. Every department maintains a stockregisteroftheequipmentsavailable. Attheendofeveryacademicyear, interdepartmental stockverification is done by senior faculty members and the report is submitted to the Principal.Thecleanlinessofthelaboratories and the equipments are maintained by the Technical Assistants and the respective lab in charges.

#### **Computers**

The Computers are maintained by Technical Assistants, System Administrator and Lab in charges. Thesoftwares installed in various places such as office, laboratories, library, departments maintained by the Institution System Administrator. To protect the computers from malware and virus, anti-virus software is regularly updated throughout the campus.

#### Library

The status of the books in the library whether available or in issue can be checked through automated library management system. The book issuing records, gate entry of the students and faculty are maintained separately. Accession register is maintained for the available books. At the end of every semester, the Librarian ensures that all the books are returned by the students and faculty.

#### **Sports Complex/ Activities**

The play field is maintained by

the Physical Director and histeam throughout the year. The play field equipment like post, umpirest and, score board s are also maintained regularly. The labourers are employed to keep the play field clean and in good condition during the tournaments and sports day celebrations.

#### **Power Supply and Electrical Maintenance**

Power supply is maintained by the Electrician of the Institution through systematic maintenanceand repair. A generator (125 KVA) is installed in the campus to handle the occasional power shut down. The UPS kept in the laboratories are maintained by the electrician frequently. The institution also has ROwater plant to provide clean drinking water to all. The water plant is maintained regularly through the Annual Maintenance Contract with the supplier.

#### **Garden Maintenance**

Tree plantation and garden maintenance are done by the gardener appointed by the institute. Manydomestic organic plants and vegetables are grown inside the campus. These plants and vegetables are usedfor cooking food in the Hostel Mess for boys and girls. Regular activities such as campus cleaning, treeplantation are conducted under social activities club like NSS, YRC to maintain the campus clean andgreen.

#### 6.1 Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)

Indra Ganesan College of Engineering is decentralized for a good governance and performance. The college is decentralized to progress well in academic as well as in administrative activities. Organogram of the Institution is framed and the roles and responsibilities at Principal level, HODs level, faculty level and student level are clearly defined in the HR policy of the institution.

#### (i) Decentralization in Academic Activities:

In the beginning of the academic year, Principal and HOD's jointly designed a calendar. The calendar activities are monitored and implemented by various committees, in which the faculty and students are the members. Time table is framed by the time table committee in which the work is delegated to one faculty member from every department. The follow up of class work activities are taken care by the class coordinators. Feedbacks are collected once in a month from the students and they are brought to the notice of the IQAC for taking necessary actions. Examination work is delegated to Exam Cell, with one senior faculty member as Exam Cell Coordinator and one faculty member from every department as department coordinators for the conduct of Internal Exams as per the academic calendar. The curriculum enrichment courses such as value added courses and certificate courses are

organized by the HOD's with Principal's approval. The HOD's also conduct meetings periodically to monitor the academic activities as planned as per the academic schedule. HOD's along with faculty members administrate the department in a better manner.

#### (ii) Decentralization in Research Activities:

Research and Development Cell of the institution promote the research activities and monitor the progress by frequently conducting meeting once in a month. R&D work is delegated to one faculty from each department. Research Proposals have been submitted by the faculty members. During this academic year our institution has received AICTE grant of Rs. 299333, to conduct Short Term Training Programme -STTP.

#### **Participative Management**

The management encourages it's faculty members who perform well in their academic activities by awarding them with certificates, cash prizes and memento. Faculty members who perform well in research activities are given research awards. Faculty members are motivated to pursue their Ph.D degree in part time and they are allowed to attend seminars, workshops and conferences.

During the end of previous academic year, the HODs submit the budget proposal to the Principal that includes budget for equipment purchase, co-curricular activities and organizing events. After reviewing the budgets given by the HODs, Principal submit the same during the Governing Council meeting. The budget is approved by the Governing Council committee and further progress is carried out.

- 6.2.2: Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:
  - ❖ Planning and Development: The institution has various committees to carry out the planning and development activities. The information about committee meetings, events are circulated through email. Also, every committee has separate WhatsApp group to disseminate the information quickly. A dedicated ERP software called e-campus is used to maintain all the academic and administrative information. Apart from having individual stock registers in all the laboratories, the list of equipments, furnitures available is also maintained as soft copy so as to get a quick reference whenever required. During pandemic this was found useful to prepare budget while working in home.
  - ❖ Administration: The ease of administration is made through the ERP software available in the institution. The information on Students Personal details, Students attendance entry, Staff Personal details, Staff attendance entry, hostel details, transport details, Fees details, Account details, Admission details, Scholarship details are maintained by this ERP software. For each student, the following transport details are included: boarding point, the bus number allotted, the bus route and the bus fees. The issue of Transfer Certificate (TC) and Course Completion (CC) Certificates are also automated. The central library is also automated with MODERNLIB-Library management software.
  - ❖ Finance and Accounts: The accounts are maintained by the accounts officer with the help of the ERP software which is a desktop application. The main features in account section of ERP software are Application fees, student fees collection, Hostel fees, fees pending list. Hence the status of the students' fees, Scholarships and other fees can be known by the Director, Principal instantly once when logged into this application since this ERP can be accessed through campus network. The financial records of all transactions like Purchase details, infrastructure maintenance, staff salary, students welfare expenses etc. are well maintained by the accounts department.
  - ❖ Student Admission and Support: Our institution follows the standard procedure as per State Government Admission norms. A separate e-governance section called admission section is available in the ERP to enter the students' details who come for admission enquiry. After admission through counselling or management, all the personal details of the students are entered in the ERP software. The students daily attendance are entered and monitored in this software. At the end of every week, the consolidated attendance report is auto generated for further follow up. The students applying for medical leave and on duty leave are also updated in the attendance monitoring system of ERP.
  - ❖ Examination: The ERP software has a separate timetable section in which the class time table, staff time table and the internal assessments schedule can be entered. After the examinations, the marks are entered in the marks entry section and if the student is absent for the exam, retest option is also available which can be activated for the eligible students. The internal marks calculation are also automated. A separate student login is available in the Anna University Examination Web portal -

coel.annauniv.edu, for all the students, in which the University results, internal marks earned by the students are made available.
